ELIGIBILITY: Site 1: Individuals who meet low-income guidelines. Gross income of 200% Federal Poverty Income Guidelines.

Other Sites: Individuals who meet low-income guidelines

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED: Site 1: Social Security cards, date of birth and proof of income for all individuals in the household and proof residency.

Other Sites: No documentation required
