Food Pantries

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Provides 400/ 35-40 pound boxes of food containing a variety of dry and frozen food (fresh or frozen fruits or vegetables when available). Offered approximately once per month per household.

ELIGIBILITY: Households who are at or below 200% of Federal Poverty Guidelines

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED: - Verification of residency (utility bill), all household income, family size and identification

- Names and ages of all household members are also required

FEES: No fees

EMERGENCY FOOD

Food Pantries

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Offers emergency food to anyone in need.

ELIGIBILITY: No restrictions

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED: No documentation required

FEES: No fees

ADMINISTRATIVE DESCRIPTION: Locally operated, private non-profit corporation that is designed to develop, administer and carry out programs that have a direct impact on the causes and instances of poverty. The primary focus is on providing assistance to the needy, as well as broaden the scope of services to benefit every section of the community.

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Site 1: Provides people who are in emergency situations with food.

ELIGIBILITY: Site 1: Individuals who meet low-income guidelines. Gross income of 200% of Federal Poverty Income Guidelines.

Other Sites: Individuals who meet low-income guidelines

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED: Site 1: Social Security Card, Date of Birth and proof of income for all in the household

Other Sites: No documentation required

FEES: No fees

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Provides a 3-5 day supply of food to low-income families in an emergency assistance situation.

ELIGIBILITY: Individuals who meet income guidelines

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED: Proof of household income and verification of family size and pictured Identification

FEES: No fees

ADMINISTRATIVE DESCRIPTION: Christian charitable organization whose main purpose is to preach the gospel, disseminate Christian truth, supply basic human necessities, provide personal counseling and undertake the spiritual and moral regeneration of all persons in need.
