SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Site 1: Provides people who are in emergency situations with vouchers that can be exchanged for clothing, furniture, bedding/linens, appliances, and household goods. Food pantry available for qualified individuals.

ELIGIBILITY: Site 1: Individuals who meet low-income guidelines. Gross income of 200% Federal Poverty Income Guidelines.

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Site 1: Provides a 3-5 day supply of food to low-income families in an emergency assistance situation. Food delivery is available to those that cannot get to the office, it is case by case.

Other Sites: Provides a 3-5 day supply of food to low-income families in an emergency assistance situation.

ELIGIBILITY: Site 1: Individuals who meet income guidelines, and those that maybe considered "over" can come in for the "first" foodbox, and then talk to the Case Worker about future plans. No one is turned away. Other Sites: Individuals who meet income guidelines

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED: Site 1: Proof of residence, proof of household income and verification of family size and pictured Identification
